In observance of the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution, a review of how women secured the right to vote nationwide will be offered. In their 72-year struggle to gain this right, four generations of women utilized a variety of political strategies and tactics. Most controversial was their creative use of street protests and the punishment inflicted upon them by a beleaguered President. These protests became a model for subsequent political movements seeking changes in public policy and in the practices of government. Attention will be given to some of the political values of the civil rights movement of the 1950s and 1960s and to the recent protests organized around the banner, "Black Lives Matter."
