Opening Doors through Non-Violence and Magnanimity

While stress, loss and uncertainty have challenged us for over a year, there is opportunity now for a transition into a new paradigm of individual and social values. Efforts to develop and practice non-violence and magnanimity offer a fundamental foundation for a world culture that nourishes human potential and establishes constructive social harmony. Persistent violence throughout the world has magnified social and economic divisions, intensified psychological suffering and left millions homeless and vulnerable. A creative transformation of human values and action through non-violence and kindheartedness is needed. Thereby, the emerging global interdependence of the last century will reveal its promise for significantly promoting the welfare of all life and of nature.

All the aims in the *Declaration of Interdependence* recognize the possibility of an emerging world culture that reflects these virtues (qualities). Aims number six and nine offer particular relevant focus:

Aim 6. To promote forums for fearless inquiry and constructive dialogue concerning the frontiers of science, the therapeutics of self-transformation, and the societies of the future.

Aim 9. To assist in the emergence of men and women of universal culture, capable of continuous growth in non-violence of mind, generosity of heart, and harmony of soul.
